Alternatively if your child wishes to practise some of their mathematical skills in their book they are welcome to do so.

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
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This half term we have been learning about fractions. Can you find a fraction of an amount of objects or can you equally split an item into equal pieces. (see example below)

Preventing spread of injection

There are general principles anyone can follow to help prevent the spread of respiratory viruses, including:

- washing your hands often with soap and water, or use alcohol sanitiser if handwashing facilities are not available. This is particularly important after taking public transport
- covering your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throwing the tissue in a bin. See <u>Catch it</u>, <u>Bin it</u>, <u>Kill it</u>
- people who geel unwell should stay at home and should not attend work or any education or childcare setting
- use an alcohol-based hand sanitiser that contains at least 60% alcohol if soap and water are not available
- avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands
- avoid close contact with people who are unwell

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- · clean and disingect grequently touched objects and surfaces
- if you are worried about your symptoms or those of a child or colleague, please call NHS III. Do not go directly to your GP or other healthcare environment
