EYFS Spring home learning challenges!

Remember to share your successful challenges on Tapestry!

- Go out into the garden. What signs of spring can you see? Draw a picture to show everyone what you saw. Can you write some labels for your picture?
- What is the weather like in spring? Talk to your grown up. What other seasons are there? Can you name them all? Can you draw a picture to show what weather is like in the 4 seasons? What clothes might you wear? What season is your favourite?
- During spring seeds begin to grow. In the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, Jack's beans grow into a magical beanstalk! Watch the story at <https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/english-ks1-jack-and-the-beanstalk-index/zn9hxyc> Can you retell the story of Jack and the Beanstalk with your adult? You could even act out the story together.
- Imagine you grew your own beanstalk. What would you like to find at the top of your beanstalk? Can you draw a picture Reception: Can you write a caption or sentence about it?
- Try making a model of a flower. You could use playdough, paper or card, construction toys, empty cardboard tubes and boxes or plastic tubs and pots. We would love to see any models you make!
- Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden.
- Go on a bug hunt. What did you find? Can you draw a picture of the different insects you found? Can you label them? You could make a bug picture using paint, pencils or craft materials.



- Go on a listening walk outside. Close your eyes and see what you can hear. Can you tell your grown up about the different sounds that you can hear? Are they quiet or loud sounds?
- Make the most of the spring sunshine and get outside to do some mark making. You could use a tub of water and a paintbrush, chalks or even a broom and water. Nursery, can you write your initial and then try some of the other letters in your name using your name card? Reception, can you write your first name and surname?
- Help your grown up to hang the washing on the line in the spring sunshine and help to develop your motor skills at the same time, squeezing the pegs together is a great workout for your fingers!
