

Go out into the garden. What signs of spring can you see? Draw an accurate observational picture of the plants you find. Label your scientific picture to show everyone what you saw. Use your knowledge organiser to help you label key parts of the plants you find.

- Make a weather chart to show what the weather is like in spring. You could print out pictures from https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-c-627-weather-symbol-cut-outs or draw your own! Why not record your own weather report!
- During spring seeds begin to grow. In the story of Jack and the Beanstalk, Jack's beans grow into a magical beanstalk! You could even act out the story together.
- Can you write an alternative version of the story Jack and the Beanstalk? What sort of bean does Jack plant? A baked bean, jelly bean, jumping bean. What could the magic beans grow into?
- Try making a model of a flower. You could use playdough, paper or card, construction toys, empty cardboard tubes and boxes or plastic tubs and pots. We would love to see any models you make!
- Try growing some plants or flowers at home.
 You could try planting some seeds in a pot or in your garden.
