- When you are out in your garden or on a walk look for the different birds you can see. You can use the identification key to help you name them. Who can spot the most birds in a week?
- Listen to the story 'The Great Pet Sale'. <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?</u> <u>v=1ISVfZAVD60</u>

Can you retell the story? Draw a picture of which animals you would buy. **Reception:** Can you write a list of all the animals that were for sale? If you could buy 3 of the animals which ones would you buy? How much money would it cost altogether? If you had a pet shop what animals would you sell?

• Go on a 3d shape hunt. Have a look around your house can you find a cube, a cone, a cuboid, a pyramid and a cylinder?



• Which colour is the fastest?

You will need: a piece of kitchen roll, felt tip pens, and a bowl of water.

- 1) Fold the piece of kitchen roll in half lengthways.
- Draw some circles along the bottom of the kitchen roll (5 or 6) at the bottom of the kitchen roll and colour them in different colours.
- 3) Hold the coloured in end of the kitchen roll in the water (remember just the end of the kitchen roll) and watch. What happens? Which colour is the fastest?

Reception: Why don't you challenge yourself further and write sentences about your pet. If you don't have a pet at home you could draw and write about an animal you would like as a pet.

- Make a model of your favourite animal. You could use Playdough, paper or card, construction toys, empty cardboard tubes and boxes or plastic tubs and pots. We would love to see any models you make!
- Can you move like different animals? Can you pounce like a cat? or Slither like a snake? or Flutter like a butterfly? or Hop like a frog? What other moves can you create?
- Can you think of a food that begins with these letters a, b, c, d, e, f, g, h, I, j, k, I, m, n, o, p, q, r, s, t, u, v, w, x, y, z, sh, ch, th?
 Who will find the most foods?

Reception: Remember to use you phonic knowledge when writing your list.

- Ask an adult to write numbers 1 to 5 (Nursery), 1 to 20 (Reception) on pieces of paper and muddle them up. How long will it take you to lay them out in the write order?
 Ask an adult to muddle them up again. Can you put them in order quicker than you did before? Did you beat your time? Keep practising, how quick can you get?
- What is the title of your favourite book? Can you read the story aloud? Don't forget to add expression! Ask your grown up to record you and put it on Tapestry.
