1) If you could be any superhero, what superhero would you be and why? Create a superhero profile with exciting adjectives to describe yourself. Could you go on an adventure and create a story using your Alan Peat sentences?

2) Make a musical instrument. Please send us any pictures of you creating these, we would love to see you getting stuck in! Take anything clean out of the recycling bin and make yourself a musical instrument. Here is an example:



3) Write an adjective for every letter of the alphabet. (Remember an adjective describes a noun!)

4) What are all the different ways you could make these amounts? 42p, 33p, 97p, 45p

5) Become an expert bug hunter! Go to an outside space and record all of the bugs you can find. Create a tally chart of your results and turn this into a pictograph.

Can you compare your data? What is the difference between the least common and the most common bug?

Challenge: Can your pictures represent different values? For example, each picture could represent two bugs instead of one.

- 6) Find a range of leaves from an outside space. Investigate which medium works best for leaf rubbings, e.g.: pens, pencils, crayons, paint, chalk etc. Can you record which worked the best? Can you choose your favourite to create a leaf rubbing picture?
- 7) Can you write a letter to the NHS staff thanking them for their work? How would you start and finish your letter?

Use your learning journal to make notes on:
 - All of the characters in the story.
 - Adjectives that could be used to describe each character.
 - A new blurb to go on the back of the book.

- 10) Imagine you have a pen pal in another country. Write a profile 'All about you'. You could include a portrait of yourself, some interesting facts about yourself and some information about our local area. What would somebody from another country want to know about where we live?
- 11) Have a look at Google Maps with a grown up and pick a place where your pen pal might live. Research this place and record your findings in your learning journal. You could research their homes, jobs, buildings and climate.
- 12) What is your favourite subject to learn about at school? Which is your least favourite? Share your ideas in your learning journal.
- 13) If there are 12 tigers in a pack, how many legs would there be altogether?
- 14) Phil has 11 horses in his stable. He gives four of his horses to Mary. How many hooves does Phil have left in his stable?

15) Design your own cake in your learning journal. What would it look like? What flavours would be included? Draw a picture of your cake design and create a set of instructions to follow for making your cake. Maybe you could test out your design with a grown up.
