Writing - Retelling the Three Billy Goats Gruff

Now you have pratised retelling the story out loud you have some writing activities to follow on from this. Choose the task you think is most suited to your child.

- Draw a picture of the troll and label him using 2a senetences. (This means using two describing words before the name of the body part) For example- He has smell, hairy toes. (Remind them to use a comma between the describing words).
- Retell the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff using 2a sentences (as explained above) and similies. Also remembering to use capital letters and full stops.

Place Value

Place Value means the value each number has. All numbers up to 9 are ones, numbers 10-90 are tens numbers and 100-900 are hundreds numbers. For example, 13 = 1 ten and 3 ones

256 = 2 hundreds, 5 tens and 6 ones

- 1. I can say the value of each number up to 100. Chose any number up to 100 and get your child to say how much each number is worth.

- 4. I can say what is 10 more or 10 less than a given number up to 500. E.g. 10 more than  $3\underline{61}$  is  $3\underline{71}$ .
