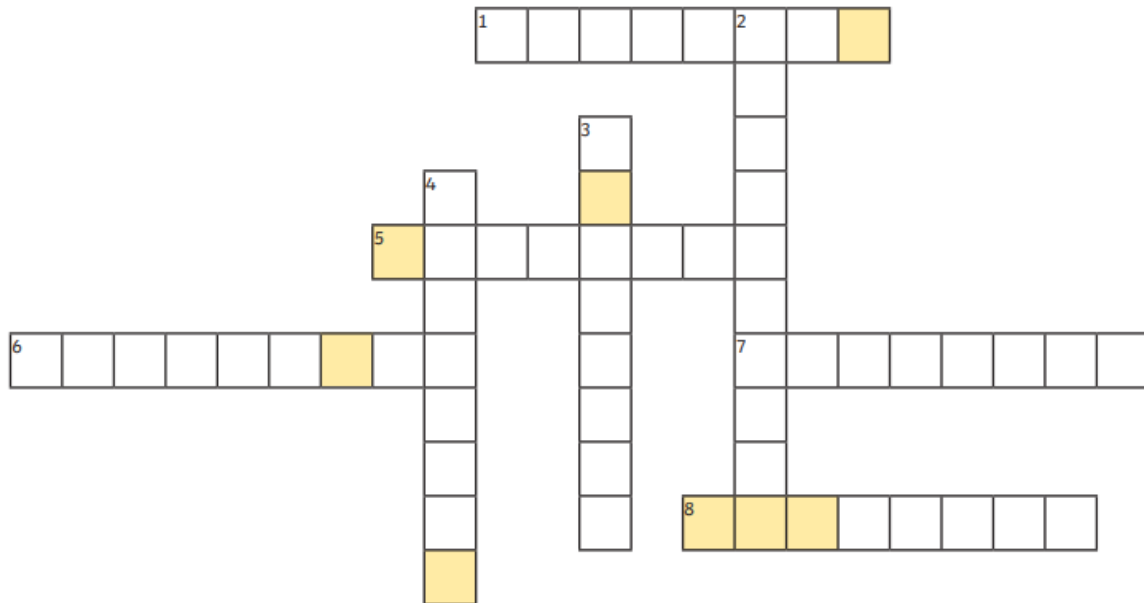

What time did the children set off for the beach?








