



## Modern Foreign Languages at NSN

Primary Languages (French) are taught confidently and consistently across Key stage 2, thereby fostering an interest in other languages, as well as raising pupil awareness according to our ASUPERHERO curriculum.

The pupils will then demonstrate their learning with 'show me what you know' tasks, relating with our ASUPERHERO curriculum.

Children can talk about their experience of learning languages and say why it has relevance to them. It should "foster their curiosity" and "provide an opening to other cultures." (National Curriculum, Purpose of Study)

### This is how we do it here...

- Our languages curriculum is derived from The National Curriculum.
- At key stage 2, children study one foreign language for up to one hour a week (French) with the lesson lasting a minimum of 30 minutes
- The children are taught one unit per half term from Rigolo. Each half-term will begin by presenting the children with a unit overview of topics to be covered. At the end of the sequence, we go back to these and ask the children to RAG rate these according to how well they now understand this topic.
- We explain **why** we are teaching topics and how it is relevant to the children's lives – now and in the future.
- Progression documents from Rigolo will inform planning and sequences of learning.
- Languages lessons are designed to promote listening, speaking, reading and writing
- The children will be using reading skills to discover information.
- Children will use a range of resources to consolidate their language knowledge and broaden their vocabulary
- We will promote the use of language by having regular enrichment days across Key Stage 2
- We will make links to the British Values where possible.

### SEND provision:

- SEND pupils will be supported within class to ensure they can access all learning through use of visual, concrete resources & scaffolding.
- Alternative teaching strategies and where appropriate targeted, effective and necessary intervention will be in place to provide a bespoke curriculum for SEND pupils
