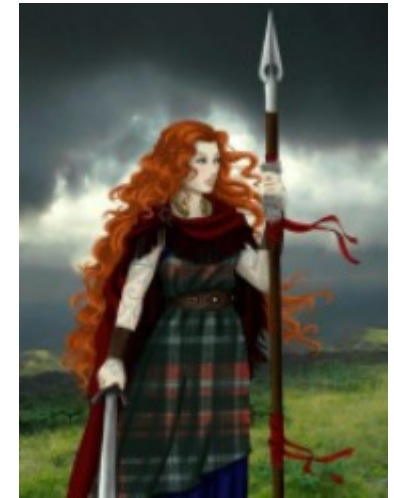

Key Vocabulary	Definition
Barbarian	An outsider believed to be inferior.
Celts	A collection of tribes who originated central Europe.
Chariot	Two wheeled, horse pulled vehicle used in racing and war.
Colosseum	An amphitheatre in the centre of the city of Rome, used for gladiator fights.
Emperor	Ruler of the Roman Empire.
Hadrian's Wall	A wall across northern Britain which helped the Romans defend their occupied land.
Iceni	A tribe that occupied the territory of present-day Norfolk and Suffolk and, under its queen Boudicca.
Mosaic	Lots of colourful pieces put together to create an image.
Sword	Long, metal, pointed weapon.
Soldier	A person who serves in the army.
Roman Empire	The name used for the land that was controlled by the Romans.
Shield	A piece of wood or metal used to protect the body from attack.
Toga	Long flowing clothes made from one piece of fabric.
